To this end, it has taken steps to rectify organisational lapses, encourage greater transparency in decision-making, as well as promote greater inclusivity by including, for the first time, a parent's representative in the Management Committee.

While we strive towards organisational excellence, our dedicated volunteers and members are also contributing to greater awareness of and participation in Petanque. Some highlights include organising local tournaments and promotional events which has engaged more than 150 participants, as well as arranging for Petanque to be played in various schools.

Our athletes and coach have also done themselves and Sports Boules Singapore proud. Under the careful guidance of Coach Anthony and much hard work at the training ground, our athletes have made significant improvements in their world rankings at the World Championship 2022 held in Denmark placing above Cambodia in the Women's Singles, above Malaysia and Philippines in the Men's Doubles.

Our athletes and coach are in the midst of preparing for the 32nd SEA Games to be held in Cambodia in 2023. The immediate goal that Sports Boules Singapore is working towards as an organisation is for our athletes to qualify for the SEA Games with the ultimate objective of securing at least a podium finish. With the continued support of the Sports Boules Singapore family, I have no doubt that they will make large strides towards these goals in the coming months.

It remains for me to thank each and every member of our Sports Boules Family for their unwavering support and dedication to the sport. While it has not been easy dealing with the seemingly insurmountable challenges that the organisation is facing, we would not have made it this far without each and every one of you.


